

Guidelines for Conducting ICCW Learn to Live Together Camp

1. Objectives The main objectives of holding this Camp is to foster friendship among the Children from States as well as to provide an effective forum for cultural exchange.
2. Duration of Camp 6 Days (5 Nights)
3. ICCW's contribution
 1. A grant as per rules is provided by ICCW to the Hosting State Council
 2. ICCW bears **TA/DA expenses** during journey period of the participants by sleeper class 3 tier Railway reservation/ordinary bus journey upto Imphal & back.
4. Parameters for participation of Children should be in the age group of 10-14 years
should be from lower income group family
should be from slum areas
should be school going children
should be able to converse in Hindi or English or Regional Language.
5. Requirements of Leaders -Escorts A sufficient level of English/Hindi to be able to understand and deal with verbal and written explanations.
They should be in the age group of 35-50 years and should be able to organize various activities in the Camp. Leaders will assume the role of a 'Contact Person' and be responsible for group preparation.
6. Participation of each State **(3 boys & 3 girls from lower income group and slum areas in the age group of 10-14 years with two escorts)**
6 Children (preferably 3 boys & 3 girls from lower income group and slum areas) Total 8 Persons
2 Leaders/Escorts
(One lady escort is compulsory for girls participants)
7. Total Number of Participants Total number of participants is approx. 200, assuming expect participation from 25 State/UT Councils and Institutional Members.

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8. Camp Activities An interaction will be arranged on furthering friendship among the participants from different States, their common culture, heritage etc. Children will be engaged in creative and recreational activities, games and sports and cultural programmes, educational tours/sight-seeing, visit to VIPs form a part of the Camp; other innovative activities can also be included in the programme by the ICCW. They will also be shown places of interest in and around the hosting city.

9. Others A stage will be prepared for cultural exchange where the children can introduce their traditional culture. Participants prepare some form of performance (eg. Folk dance, the National Anthem, Vande Matram etc.).
Every delegation should prepare two minutes' programme for the inauguration and valedictory function.
Participants should bring with them their traditional costumes/dresses.
Parents are **not allowed** to accompany the children.
Free boarding/lodging arrangements will be made by the hosting State Council .
Only two Escorts are allowed. More than two escorts will not be entertained in any capacity.
Self-Introduction Sheet be sent to the Hosting State Council with a copy to ICCW along with the schedule of arrival of the participants at Camp Site.
